HANSON-ROBERTS TAROT

The complete seventy-eight card tarot pack I is divided into two sections: twenty-two Major Arcana and fifty-six Minor Arcana cards. The twenty-two Major Arcana cards, also known as Triumphs, Atouts, and Greater Arcana, comprise twenty-one allegorical cards numbered from I to XXI plus an unnumbered card known as The Fool

The sequence of the Hanson-Roberts Major

Arcana follows the designation by Arthur Edward Waite who assigned number VIII to Strength and XI to Justice. By contrast, most traditional tarot decks designate VIII as Justice and XI as Strength.

Generally the Major Arcana cards represent the physical and spiritual forces of life—illness, death, storms, strength, power, religion, and love. The remaining fifty-six cards are called Minor Arcana or Lesser Arcana.

They are divided into four suits:

Swords — spades

Rods (Wands) — clubs Cups — hearts

Pentacles (Coins) — diamonds

Each of the four suits contains four court cards and ten pip cards numbered 1 (ace) through 10. The four court cards in each suit are called King, Queen, Knight, and Page.

The Minor Arcana cards generally represent occupations, social position, and status.

The precise origin of tarot cards remains obscure. It is sometimes theorized that the tarot deck was created as a seventy-eight card deck. However, it might be that the twenty-two Major Arcana cards with their emblematic designs and the fifty-six Minor Arcana cards in their familiar four suits were originally devised separately and later were combined into one pack.

Italian Renaissance nobility of the midfifteenth century in northern Italy amused themselves by playing a game called *trionfi*, subsequently called *tarocchi*, using the earliest extant tarot pack.

THE ARTIST

The artist of the Hanson-Roberts Tarot deck was born on April Fool's Day—April 1, 1947—and grew up in Massachusetts. She won a scholarship to Dean Junior College and graduated in 1966 with a major in Fine Arts.

After graduation, Mary Hanson-Roberts joined a summer stock company and, finding her drawings more in demand than her acting, she became their poster designer. She also began freelancing on a part-time basis. While concentrating mainly on portraiture, she gained valuable experience in a variety of areas. One project, the design of a logo for Summerthing, a program sponsored by Boston's Department of Recreation, led to staff work as an illustrator on the Department's newsletter. There were also several small gallery shows and a commission to design a coloring book that was distributed to hospitalized children at Christmastime.

In 1977, the artist moved to Florida to try freelancing on a full-time basis. She produced a second coloring book that received favorable notice at the World Science Fiction Convention in Miami. Her work, becoming more oriented toward fantasy and occult themes, began to win recognition and awards at local galleries and shows

At one of the shows, the artist met her future husband and they live today in Florida with

their two sons and a menagerie of cats. Ms. Hanson-Roberts is now primarily a magazine illustrator. In addition, she also prepares designs for books and film animation. She especially enjoys science fiction work, but her diverse interests recently led her to complete a series of paintings of the twelve disciples.

The Hanson-Roberts Tarot deck represents a major work of the artist. She devoted approximately eight months to the execution of the eighty-one pieces of art (seventy-eight face cards of the twenty-two Major Arcana and fifty-six Minor Arcana, plus top card, introduction card, and back design). The original artwork, approximately twice the size of the finished printed cards, was created with colored pencil.

The artist has long admired the work of Pamela Colman Smith in the Rider-Waite Tarot deck. The Hanson-Roberts designs provide added relevance to the work of Pamela Colman Smith while presenting a new dimension to the tarot through the special interpretations and artistic genius of Mary Hanson-Roberts and her magnificent illustrations.

THE 22 MAJOR ARCANA

0 · THE FOOL

A YOUNG MAN dressed in colorful garments is shown walking in an open field. In his right hand, and resting over his right shoulder, is a stick which symbolizes his desire and will. A bundle bearing his previous experiences is attached to the stick. In his left hand he holds a white rose to symbolize his spiritual desires.

Divinatory Meanings: Thoughtlessness. Folly. Extravagance. Lack of discipline. Immaturity. Foolishness. Inconsideration. Frenzy. Enthusiasm. Irrational insecurity. Frivolity. Delirium. Reverse Meanings: Faulty choice or a bad decision. Indecision. Apathy. Hesitation. Neeligence.

I • THE MAGICIAN

THE MAGICIAN stands before a table on which are the suit symbols of the Minor Arcana: a sword, a rod, a cup, and a pentacle. Above his head appears the figure eight, the ancient occult number ascribed to Hermes and the symbol of eternal life. Around him is a garden of lilies and roses. The Magician holds in his upraised hand the phallic wand of creativity—with his other hand he points downward. This derived from above. The Magician possesses the ability of utilizing the diverse objects on his table for success in thought, word, and action.

Divinatory Meanings: Originality and creativity. Ability to utilize one's capabilities in order to accomplish a task. Imagination. Self-reliance. Ingenuity. Spontaneity. Self-control. Self-confidence. Flexibility. Masterfulness. Deception. Sleight of hand. Reverse Meanings: Weakness of will. Indecision. Ineptitude. Insecurity. Disquiet. Delay. The use of one's skills for destructive ends.

II · THE HIGH PRIESTESS

THE HIGH PRIESTESS is seated within the precincts of her temple. She holds on her lap a book of knowledge and esoteric wisdom. She is a large woman—suggesting challenge to masculine domination. She is the eternal feminine goddess of the ancient world, emanating both knowledge and wisdom into the life around her.

Divinatory Meanings: Wisdom. Sound judgment. Serene knowledge. Common sense. Serenity. Objectivity. Penetration. Foresight. Intuition. Comprehension. Perception. Self-reliance. Lack of emotion. Platonic relationships. Reverse Meanings: Shortsightedness. Ignorance. Selfishness. Passion. Acceptance of superficial knowledge. Poor judgment.

III · THE EMPRESS

THE EMPRESS IS SEATED upon her throne. In her right hand she holds a scepter of authority. She is surrounded by ripe fruit and grain. The

Empress suggests the symbol of feminine productivity and action. By effectively mobilizing all her capabilities, she can create meaningful and noteworthy developments in her life.

Divinatory Meanings: Feminine progress. Fruitfulness. Fertility. Mother. Sister. Wife. Accomplishment. Ability to motivate others. Practicality. Intuition. Marriage. Children. Feminine influence. Reverse Meanings: Vacillation. Inaction. Lack of concentration or interest. Indecision. Delay in accomplishment or progress. Anxiety. Infertility. Infidelity.

IV . THE EMPEROR

A REGAL MAN of middle age sits upon a throne decorated with rams' heads. He wears a crown of living leaves. A ceremonial scepter is in his right hand and with his left hand he holds a worldly globe of dominion. He exudes confidence and accomplishment.

Divinatory Meanings: Worldly power. Accomplishment. Confidence. Authority. Wealth. Stability. Indomitable spirit. Leadership. War-making tendencies. Male influence. Patriarchal figure. Father. Brother. Husband. Domination of reason and intelligence over emotion and passion. Strength. Attainment of goals. Reverse Meanings: Immaturity. Ineffectiveness. Lack of strength. Indecision. Inability. Weakness of character. Feebleness. Failure to control petty emotions.

V · HIEROPHANT

A PAPAL FIGURE with beard and mustache holds a three-tiered staff in his left hand. He wears the triple crown of papal authority. The crossed keys indicate the keys to his kingdom. He appears to give a blessing with his right hand to the two figures before him. The Hierophant possesses creative power throughout the divine, intellectual, and physical worlds. Behind him are two columns—one symbolizing law and order, the other the right to choose whether to obey or to disobey.

Divinatory Meanings: A tendency to cling to former ideas and principles even if outdated. Ritualism. Mercy. Forgiveness. Inspiration. Kindness. Compassion. Servitude. Inactivity. Reverse Meanings: Over-kindness. Foolish exercise of generosity. Susceptibility. Impotence. Unconventionality. Unorthodoxy. Vulnerability. Frailty. Renunciation.

VI • THE LOVERS

A YOUNG LAD AND MAIDEN stand together, hands clasped. Above them appears a winged angel who protects them. The Lovers represent all that is essential in the interaction of love and affection between human beings.

Divinatory Meanings: Love. Beauty. Perfection. Harmony. Confidence. Honor. Trust. Beginning of a possible romance. Deep feeling. Oblivious to possible consequences. Optimism. Freedom of emotion. The necessity of testing or subjecting to trial. Struggle between sacred and profane love. A meaningful affair. Reverse Meanings: Failure to meet the test. Unreliability. Separation. Frustration in love and marriage. Interference by others. Fickleness. Untrustworthiness. Unwise plans.

VII • THE CHARIOT

A CROWNED CONQUEROR rides in a chariot drawn by two sphinxes representing negative and positive forces. The man bears a scepter in his right hand and wears a suit of armor emblazoned with facial epaulets on each shoulder. The faces may represent the Urim and Thummim, revealers of the divine will of God. The Chariot represents the material currents which carry man along toward his destiny.

Divinatory Meanings: Trouble. Adversity, possibly already overcome. Conflicting influence. Turmoil. Vengeance. Voyage or journey. Escape. Urgency to gain control of one's emotions. Reverse Meanings: Defeat. Failure. Losing something otherwise within your grasp at the last minute. Sudden collapse of plans. Conquered.

VIII · STRENGTH

A WOMAN GENTLY HOLDS the jowls of a massive lion who rests in her control. Above her head appears the eternal figure eight or cosmic lemniscate. Divinatory Meanings: Strength. Courage. Fortitude. Conviction. Energy. Determination. Resolution. Defiance. Action. Confidence. Innate ability. Zeal. Fervor. Accomplishment. Reverse Meanings: Weakness. Pettiness. Impotency. Sickness. Tyranny. Lack of faith. Abuse of power.

IX • THE HERMIT

AN ELDERLY, BEARDED MAN wearing a heavy habit holds aloft in his right hand a lantern that represents the knowledge of occult science. Light emanates from the six-pointed star, symbol of creation and divine protection. The Hermit travels the path of initiation and knowledge. He is ready to assist others with counsel and advice. He is the guardian of time, dispensing wisdom and truth.

Divinatory Meanings: Knowledge. Counsel. Solicitude. Prudence. Discretion. Caution. Vigilance. Circumspection. Fear of discovery. Self-denial. Withdrawal. Regression. Annulment. Tendency to withhold emotion. Reverse Meanings: Imprudence. Hastiness. Rashness. Prematurity. Foolish acts. Incorrect advice. Immaturity. Failure caused by dullness. Overly cautious, resulting in unnecessary delay.

X · WHEEL OF FORTUNE

THE WHEEL OF FORTUNE contains eight visible spokes, each indicating a state of life, and four spokes are marked with alchemical sigils

of mercury, sulphur, water, and salt. The letters T A R O are interspersed with the four Hebrew letters I H V H for Jehovah. The serpent on the left descending the wheel is falling into misfortune while the animal on the right appears to be rising out of previous difficulties. At the four corners of the card are four biblical creatures, each with a book.

Divinatory Meanings: Destiny. Fortune. Fate. Outcome. Culmination. Approaching the end of a problem. Good or bad depending upon influences of nearby cards. Inevitability. The entire sequence of the Wheel suggests the course of things from beginning to end. Advancement for better or worse. Reverse Meanings: Failure. Poor luck. Broken sequence. Unexpected bad fate. Interruption or inconsistency due to unexpected events. Outside influences not contemplated.

XI · JUSTICE

A CROWNED FEMALE FIGURE holds the scales of justice and a heavy, double-edged sword which endows her with the ability to decide right from wrong. Justice is capable of the fair administration of manners and morals according to the best interests of the persons involved.

Divinatory Meanings: Reasonableness. Fairness. Justice. Proper balance. Harmony. Righteousness. Virtue. Honor. Virginity. The eventual outcome, whether favorable or not, will truly be fair for the person concerned.

Reverse Meanings: False accusations. Bigotry. Severity in judgment. Intolerance. Unfairness. Abuse. Bias

XII · THE HANGED MAN

A YOUNG MAN HANGS from a tall cross by his right foot. His hands are secured behind his back. The man's eyes are open and he remains fully conscious and aware of his surroundings. The Hanged Man is depicted in a state of inertia. Although earthbound, he has attained some relief from the transition of life.

Divinatory Meanings: Life in suspension. Transition. Change. Reversal of the mind and one's way of life. The changing of life's forces. The period of respite between significant events. Sacrifice. Readjustment. Rebirth. Regeneration. The approach of new life forces. Reverse Meanings: Unwillingness to make the necessary effort. Lack of sacrifice. Failure to give of one's self. Preoccupation with the ego. False prophecy. Useless sacrifice.

XIII · DEATH

A SKELETON CLAD IN ARMOR carries a black flag with a five-petaled white rose. He rides a white horse while kings, women, and children lie dead and ashen before him. In defeating the physical body, the skeletal knight prepares the way for resurrection of the soul. The skeleton represents changes in the present which will influence the events of the future

Divinatory Meanings: Transformation. Clearing away the old to make way for the new. Unexpected change. Loss. Failure. Alteration. The ending of a familiar situation or friendship. Loss of income or financial security. Beginning of a new era. Illness. Reverse Meanings: Stagnation. Immobility. Slow changes. Partial change. Inertia. Narrowly avoiding a serious accident.

XIV · TEMPERANCE

THIS CARD DEPICTS THE VIRTUE of Temperance as a winged angel robed in flowing garments—pouring liquid from one urn to another. The essence of life flows between the two vessels, symbolic of the flowing of the past through the present and into the future. The triangle within the square on Temperance's breast represents the presence of spirit within the confines of reality. The angel of Temperance possesses moderation and self-restraint. She is secure and self-reliant.

Divinatory Meanings: Moderation. Harmony. Fusion. Patience. Management. Compatibility. Fortunate omen. Successful combination. Consolidation. Accommodation. The bringing together into perfect union. Accomplishment through self-control and frugality. Reverse Meanings: Discord. Disunion. Conflict of interest. Hostility. Inability to work with others. Impatience. Sterility. Difficulty in understanding others. Frustrations.

XV • THE DEVIL

THIS CARD SHOWS A HORNED, bat-winged demon with elongated ears. A pentacle is inverted on his forehead, signifying perversion of the five senses. The Devil is elevated on a pedestal. He holds in his left hand an inverted torch of destruction. His right hand is upraised in the sign of black magic. The Devil is the bearer of misery, disaster, and death. Two figures are tied by their necks to the base of the Devil's pedestal. This card indicates human suffering and desolation. However, the bondage suffered by the two figures could be broken by positive determination and willpower.

Divinatory Meanings: Subordination. Ravage. Subservience. Downfall. Lack of success. Weird experience. Bad outside influence or advice. Black magic. Unexpected failure. Inability to realize one's goals. Reverse Meanings: Release from bondage. Throwing off shackles. Respite. Divorce. Recognition of one's needs by another person. Overcoming severe handicaps. The beginning of spiritual understanding. The first steps toward enlightenment.

XVI • THE TOWER

A TALL TOWER with a crowned roof has been struck violently by a blast of lightning and fire. Only the top, the crown, is severed, signifying a clean break from the past. The flame is a symbol of a strong and dominating occurrence.

Two persons fall to the ground. The falling figures represent escape from the past and sudden immersion into new events. The card is variously called The Lightning Struck Tower, The House of God, The Hospital, Fire of Heaven, or The Tower of Babel.

Divinatory Meanings: Complete and sudden change. Breaking down of old beliefs.
Abandonment of past relationships. Severing
of a friendship. Changing of one's opinion.
Unexpected events. Disruption. Adversity.
Misery. Deception. Bankruptcy. Downfall.
Loss of stability. Loss of security. Reverse
Meanings: Continued oppression. Following
old ways. Living in a rut. Entrapment in an
unhappy situation. Inability to affect any
worthwhile change.

XVII · THE STAR

A NAKED YOUNG MAIDEN pours the waters of life from her open palms. This signifies the stirring of new ideas and the precipitation of new concepts. Although the maiden appears complacent, her outlook remains one of aspiration and hope. Hovering in the sky above her is the Star of the Magi—surrounded by seven smaller stars. The eight-pointed stars of hope ascend above the maiden. A bird and flowers evidence the birth of life and promise.

Divinatory Meanings: Hope. Faith. Inspiration. Bright prospects. Mixing of the past and present. Optimism. Insight. Good omen. Spiritual love. Astrological influence. Accumulation of past knowledge for use in the present. The proper balancing of desire and work, hope and effort, love and expression. Reverse Meanings: Unfulfilled hopes. Bad luck. Disappointment. Lack of opportunity. Pessimism. Conclusion of an unsatisfactory business experience or social friendship. Bullheadedness. Stubbornness. Imbalance.

XVIII • THE MOON

A DOG AND A WOLF howl at the moon, which cradles a face in profile and drops the moisture of intuition and psychic knowledge. Two ominous towers rise in the background. In the foreground a crayfish rises from a pond, signifying uncontrolled manifestations of the subconscious. This card suggests the presence of envy, deception, jealousy, and prejudice in daily life. It is a card of caution and danger.

Divinatory Meanings: Disillusionment. Deception. Twilight. Caution. Obscurity. Intuition. Bad influence. Danger. Ulterior motives. Insincerity. False friends. Selfishness. Deceit. Double dealing. Craftiness. False pretenses. Disgrace. Slander. Liable. An insincere relationship. Superficiality. Unknown enemies. Reverse Meanings: A minor deception recognized before damage is done. Trifling mistakes. Overcoming bad temptations. Realizing gains without paying the price. Taking advantage of someone.

A BEAMING SUN shines down upon a naked child astride a horse. Four sunflowers represent the four elements of earth, fire, water, and air. The sun's rays shine out and touch all the earth. From the sun's rays flow strong and positive solar energies which permeate all living beings and give rise to feelings of contentment and satisfaction. This card represents the fulfillment of love and friendship.

Divinatory Meanings: Accomplishment. Satisfaction. Contentment. Favorable relationships. Love. Joy. Devotion. Engagement. A happy marriage. Pleasure in daily existence. Warmth. A good friend. Sincerity. Pleasures derived from simple things. Achievement in the arts. Liberation. Reverse Meanings: Unhappiness. Loneliness. Possibly a broken engagement or marriage. Cancelled plans. Triumph delayed although not necessarily completely lost. Clouded future. Lack of friendship.

XX · JUDGMENT

THIS CARD DEPICTS a winged angel blowing a trumpet. Attached to the trumpet is a banner bearing the design of a cross. Below, a family rises from shallow waters. The woman is posed with clasped hands. This card suggests the revival and reawakening of the individuals concerned, and a call to atonement for that which

is past and present. The shroud of the past is cleansed away. The deeper our emotions and sorrows, the richer our atonements and joys.

Divinatory Meanings: The need to repent and forgive. Atonement. Judgment. The moment to account for the manner in which we have used our opportunities. Rebirth. Rejuvenation. Improvement. Development. Promotion. The desire for immortality. Legal judgment in one's favor. One should carefully consider present actions as they affect other persons. Reverse Meanings: Indecision. Delay. Disappointment. Failure to face facts. Divorce. Procrastination. Theft. Alienation of affection.

XXI • THE WORLD

A CLOTHED FEMALE FIGURE stands within the center of an oval wreath. She holds a thin wand in each hand, symbolizing the powers she commands. Her powers are a direct result of all the efforts described in the preceding cards and of the energy of conscious and subconscious concentration. In each of the four corners of the card appears a symbolic figure from the Apocalypse. In the upper left is a man or angel and in the upper right an eagle. In the lower corners are the figures of a bull and a lionguardians of the truth. All that has taken place before now culminates in ultimate completion. The four corners of the card suggest the four elements of air (man), water (eagle), fire (lion), and earth (bull), which are balanced to form the basis of life on earth and the composition of each day.

Divinatory Meanings: Attachment. Completion. Perfection. Ultimate change. The end result of all efforts. Success. Assurance. Fulfillment. Capability. Triumph in undertakings. The rewards that come from hard work. Admiration of others. The outcome of events in spite of other signs. Reverse Meanings: Imperfection. Failure to complete the task one starts. Lack of vision. Failure. Disappointment.

THE 56 MINOR ARCANA

THE SUIT OF SWORDS

(CORRESPONDS TO SPADES)

Swords generally represent courage, force, strength, boldness, authority, aggression, and ambition. These cards indicate activity, progress, and accomplishment for good or bad, or sometimes misfortune and disaster. This is the suit of leaders and warriors.

KING OF SWORDS

THE KING OF SWORDS is cloaked and wears an armored head cover. He sits in judgment, holding unsheathed the sign of his suit. A pouncing eagle is on the back of his throne. Behind him storm clouds gather.

Divinatory Meanings: An active and determined person. Experienced. Authoritative. Controlled. Commanding. A professional man. Someone proficient in his field. Highly analytical. Justice. Force. Superiority. A person having many ideas, thoughts, and designs. Reverse Meanings: Cruelty. Selfishness. Conflict. Sadism. One who causes unnecessary disturbance and sadness. A dangerous or wicked person. Perversity.

QUEEN OF SWORDS

THE QUEEN OF SWORDS sits upon her throne. The upraised sword in her right hand represents a quick-witted and capable person. Her countenance is severe and preoccupied. A stormy and desolate landscape is behind her. She is one who has suffered a great loss but bears up nobly under her misfortune.

Divinatory Meanings: Sharp. Intensely perceptive. A keen person. Quick-witted. May signify a widow or woman of sadness. A subtle person. Mourning. Privation. Absence. Loneliness. Separation. One who has savored great happiness but who presently knows the anxiety of misfortune and reversal. Reverse Meanings: Narrow-mindedness. Bigotry. Maliciousness. Deceitfulness. Vengefulness. Prudishness. A treacherous enemy.

KNIGHT OF SWORDS

THE KNIGHT OF SWORDS, a forceful figure dressed in full armor, rides horseback, brandishing his sword. He is the defender of good and opponent of evil—a symbol of chivalry and bravery. He is courageous and good at heart. He is the forerunner of activity.

Divinatory Meanings: Bravery. Skill. Capacity. The strength and dash of a young man. Heroic action. Opposition and war. Impetuous rush into the unknown without fear. A master in the art of action and warfare. Reverse Meanings: Incapacity. Imprudence. Dispute or ruin over a woman. Impulsive mistakes. Conceited fool. Simplicity. Disunion.

PAGE OF SWORDS

THE PAGE OF SWORDS wears a fur hat and a regal costume with flowing cape. He clasps an

upright sword in both hands.

Divinatory Meanings: Vigilance. Agility. Spying. A discreet person. An active youth. A lithe figure. This card symbolizes a person adept at perceiving, discerning, and uncovering the unknown or that which is less than obvious. The quality of insight. Reverse Meanings: An imposter revealed. Illness is also possible. Powerless in the face of stronger forces. Lack of preparation.

TEN OF SWORDS

A PROSTRATE FIGURE is shown pierced by the swords of his suit.

Divinatory Meanings: Ruin. Affliction. Pain. Sadness. Mental anguish. Desolation. Tears. Misfortune. Trouble. Disappointment. Grief. Sorrow. Reverse Meanings: Benefit. Improvement. Temporary gain or profit. Passing success. Momentary advantage.

NINE OF SWORDS

A SLEEPLESS WOMAN sits bowed in despair, oppressed by nine swords.

Divinatory Meanings: Misery. Concern. Unhappiness, Miscarriage. Anxiety over a loved one. Worry. Despair. Suffering. Reverse Meanings: Doubt. Slander. Gossip. Shame. Suspicion, Timidity. Reasonable fear.

EIGHT OF SWORDS

A WOMAN, BOUND and blindfolded, is surrounded by the swords of her suit.

THE TEN-CARD

THE TEN-CARD SPREAD is one of the most popular and effective methods of using the tarot for divination. It is a slightly altered version of the Ancient Celtic Method described by Arthur Edward Waite in *The Pictorial Key to the Tarot*.

The person seeking an answer to a question is known as the questioner or querent. The questioner sits at a table opposite the diviner and both persons maintain a serious mental attitude. The questioner must clear his mind of all thoughts except the specific question to be answered. This question is stated aloud to the diviner while the questioner simultaneously


shuffles the face down deck. The person who handles the cards impregnates them with personal magnetism and thereby creates a rapport between the subconscious and the cards. The cards may be shuffled either hand over hand or by riffling (separating the deck into two parts and riffling with the thumb so the cards are well mixed). The shuffling must be done by the person seeking an interpretation or prediction—not by the reader, interpreter, or diviner. When the questioner is satisfied with the shuffling, he or she places the deck face down in front of the diviner. The cards are always viewed from the diviner's position.

Beginning with the top card as number one, the second card as number two, and so on, the diviner turns up the first six cards, one at a time, placing them face up on the table in the sequence shown in the diagram at right.

The diviner should turn the cards over from left to right thereby assuring that the cards continue to point in the same direction as when placed on the table by the questioner. The cards which face the diviner are said to be positioned for a strong, positive reading. The cards which face the questioner are said to be upside down or inverted and therefore have a weak, delayed, or even reversed meaning.

If the first card turned over by the diviner is upside down, the diviner should reverse the first card so that it is displayed upright. The remaining nine cards should then be turned over from bottom to top in such a manner as to reverse the direction of each of these cards since the questioner may have mistakenly handed the deck upside down to the diviner.

Generally, if more than half the cards are reversed, the diviner may find a more consistent reading is obtained by returning any reversed cards to their upright position.



CARD NUMBER 1 • Present Position

Atmosphere in which the questioner is presently working and living. Shows the area of influence in which the questioner presently exists. This card represents the questioner.

CARD NUMBER 2 • Immediate Influence Shows the nature of the influence or immediate sphere of involvement or obstacles which lie just ahead. This card crosses the questioner.

CARD NUMBER 3 • Goal or Destiny
The ultimate goal or destiny of the questioner.
Indicates the best that can be accomplished by
the questioner based on existing circumstances. This card may also represent the questioner's aim or ideal within the present frame
of reference. This card crowns the questioner.

CARD NUMBER 4 • Distant Past Foundation Represents the broad and basic events and influences which existed in the past and upon which the present events are based. This card is behind the questioner.

CARD NUMBER 5 • Recent Past Events

Shows the most recent sphere of influence or
events which have passed or which are just
passing. This card may represent distant past
influences exerting pressure on recent events.
This card is beneath the questioner.

CARD NUMBER 6 • Future Influence Shows the sphere of influence that is coming into being in the near future in a broad sense. This card is in front of the auestioner. After reading the preceding six cards, the diviner proceeds to turn over the next four cards from the deck, placing them one above the other in a line to the right of the previous six cards, as shown in the diagram on page 45.

CARD NUMBER 7 • The Questioner

Shows the questioner in his present position or attitude within the surrounding circumstances. Attempts to place the questioner in proper perspective.

CARD NUMBER 8 • Environmental Factors Denotes the questioner's influence on other people and his position in life. Reveals those tendencies and factors which exist with respect to other persons who may have an effect on the questioner.

CARD NUMBER 9 • Inner Emotions

Shows the inner hopes, hidden emotions and secret desires, fears, and anxieties of the questioner. Includes those thoughts which will come to the mind of the questioner in the future.

CARD NUMBER 10 • Final Result

The culmination and results which will be brought about from all of the influences as revealed by the other cards in the divination, provided events and influences continue as indicated.
